



South Africa Fact Sheet

Highlights of Operations

Chevron is a leading refiner and marketer of petroleum products in South Africa. Our network of Caltex-branded service stations helps make us one of the country's top four petroleum brands.

We operate a refinery in Milnerton, Cape Town, that produces gasoline, diesel and aviation fuel, kerosene, fuel oil, and other products. Chevron also has interests in a lubricant oil manufacturing plant in Durban.

One of Chevron's three global hubs for the supply and trading organization is located in Cape Town. The unit manages Chevron's global supply – maximizing our crude oil revenues while reducing the cost of raw materials and transportation.

Chevron also is a responsible member of the community, promoting health, education and the arts in South Africa.

Business Portfolio

Worldwide, nearly a quarter of all Chevron's Caltex-branded service stations are in South Africa. These retail outlets sell products such as transportation fuels and axle grease.

Caltex has approximately 870 retail outlets, 28 terminals and a fleet of some 132 tanker trucks.

Our Cape Town refinery produces a range of fuels as well as sulfur, liquefied petroleum gas and paving asphalt. Chevron's share in the refinery is 110,000 barrels per day.

A consortium of Black Economic Empowerment business partners and employees holds 25 percent of Chevron South Africa (Pty) Limited, which owns the Cape Town Refinery.

In Durban, Chevron has a significant share in a lubricant oil manufacturing plant and maintains a laboratory and blending plant, which produces lubricating oils and greases.

In the Community

Chevron's philosophy focuses on investing in people, partnerships and performance.

Chevron's social investment program in South Africa promotes real and sustained economic growth. Our social investment spending in South Africa is focused in these areas:

- Education and training
- HIV/AIDS awareness
- Community development
- Arts and culture
- Environmental management, including education and conservation

We support formal education, including preschool and basic adult education. Chevron encourages community development by promoting arts, culture, good health and community services. Education about the environment and conservation are supported. Chevron also provides disaster relief and general assistance to the needy.

As a way of developing the country's workforce, Chevron supports Black Economic Empowerment, a government initiative that helps women and historically disadvantaged people to learn skills and get jobs.

Record of Achievement

Chevron has played an important role in South Africa, meeting the country's fuel needs since 1911.

In 1936, a partnership between Chevron and Texaco created the Caltex brand. In 1966, Caltex bolstered our standing as a key South Africa investor with the construction of a refinery in Milnerton, Cape Town.

Chevron has a long track record of contributing to the economy of South Africa while operating safely and protecting the environment.

Health, Environment and Safety

Chevron is committed to the highest health, environment and safety standards.

South Africa is one of several countries chosen to participate in the Arrive Alive program, which is reducing driving accidents among employees, their families and other members of the public. Working with other agencies, messages about safe driving are aired on the radio. The ads also appear in print publications, on billboards, and on signs on buses and taxis.

Employees benefit from Chevron's HIV/AIDS awareness program, which teaches them how to keep themselves and their families healthy. The program encourages voluntary AIDS testing and then educates those who test negative on how to stay that way. Those who test positive are shown how they can prolong their lives and stay productive. Through the increased awareness and the support it provides, the program is having a positive impact on our employees, the economy and the future of South Africa.

A new water recycling plant at the Cape Town refinery produces all of the water needed in the refining process. Every month, the water conserved by the refinery is the equivalent of that used by 6,000 homes. The recycling plant also reduces the refinery's burden on the city's sewage facility.

Economy

Chevron South Africa's manufacturing, marketing, distribution and support services sites employ approximately 1,450 people. The multiplier effect of wages, salaries and business investments makes Chevron an important contributor to South Africa's economy.

In addition, our Caltex operations transfer knowledge and experience to South Africans and bring the latest technologies to the country.

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
