Dear Community Member:

As part of Chevron's continuing dialogue with our neighbors, I'd like to share with you a report of our 2009 community investments. We've listened to our local communities and the City on ways we can better contribute to improving the quality of life for all Richmond residents. Based on these discussions, we have prioritized our funding in three main areas: **public safety**, focusing on at-risk youth; **improving the quality of K-12 education**; and **economic development** with a focus on job creation. The attached report shows we invested over \$3.4 million in 2009 – primarily to these areas.

We also encourage our employees to donate their time and talents to the community. For example, Chevron employees served meals at local homeless shelters and mentored high school students interested in science, engineering, math and other technical careers. In addition to volunteering their time, our local employees have donated over \$612,000 of their own money to Bay Area nonprofits in 2009. These contributions were matched by Chevron Corporation, therefore doubling employees' donations.

Looking ahead to 2010, we know there is still a lot of work to be done. I believe that by continuing to work together, we will help make Richmond a better place to live and to do business, and Chevron is committed to help.
