My name is Robert Serewa and I'm a captain with Chevron Shipping.

I try to get myself out for my rounds on deck. I choose different areas every single time.

This is my chance to interact with the crew members. I strongly believe in that habit, because that sends the message that the captain's interested in the running life of the ship.

Among all of these activities, the number priority for myself is the safe passage of this ship.

Life at sea is definitely very much different to what everybody else does ashore.

We tend to split our existence in between here and the family life. I felt like when I'm coming here I find my solitude.

I have a daughter and it was one of the most exciting moments throughout my career to have my daughter, together with my father, on board. That kind of made her realize what the job is actually looking like. So, it was a big discovery for both myself and for my daughter, really good moment.
